

















Estimated demand for volunteers



Volunteer program structure








Volunteer Hubs





- ✓ Can work hardly, under the pressure. Has good physical condition
- ✓ Can work in a Team
- ✓ Speaks English good

Selection process will include:

- ✓ Test of English Language
- ✓ Assessment of professional skills
- ✓ Personal skills assessment
- ✓ Documents check
- ✓ Final approval of a candidate






Sport VolunteersRecruitment






Global Sports Forum Trophy Award Sochi 2014 Volunteer Hubs Project
